

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL

### **Hearing Date, Time, and Location:**

The Lake Oswego City Council will hold a public hearing on <u>Tuesday</u>, June 1, 2021, at **5:30 p.m.** 

Due to COVID-19 and Executive Orders issued by Governor Brown, city facilities are currently closed to the public. This meeting will be held virtually and all members of the City Council are attending remotely. Several avenues are available to the public for viewing or participating remotely. ### **Nature of Application and Proposed Legislative Amendments:**

The City Council may amend Ordinance 2815 (temporarily allowing Short-Term Rentals) by amending the ordinance to extend the sunset clause to a date certain, Option 1, or by removing the sunset clause allowing short-term rentals to continue, Option 2.

On April 26, 2021, the Planning Commission made a recommendation that the City Council extend the sunset clause on short-term rentals to July 16, 2022.

The amendment would be implemented through the adoption of Ordinance 2869 (Options A or B), which will be considered at the public hearing. The titles of the ordinance are as follows:

#### Ordinance 2869 (Option 1)

An ordinance of the Lake Oswego City Council amending Ordinance 2815 (Allowing Short-Term Rental Lodging Use in Certain Zones) by extending the sunset date in Section 4 (Sunset Provision) (PP 21-0004).

## Ordinance 2869 (Option 2)

An ordinance of the Lake Oswego City Council repealing Section 4 (Sunset Provision) of Ordinance 2815 (Allowing Short-Term Rental Lodging Use in Certain Zones) (PP 21-0004).

#### Time Limits on Testimony:

The purpose of time limits on testimony is to provide all interested persons with an adequate opportunity to present and respond to testimony while at the same time ensuring that the hearing can be conducted in an efficient and expeditious manner. The following time limits on testimony shall be observed, but may be changed by the Council.

- Ten minutes for a representative of a recognized neighborhood association, homeowner association, government agency, or other incorporated public interest organization;
- Five minutes for other persons.
