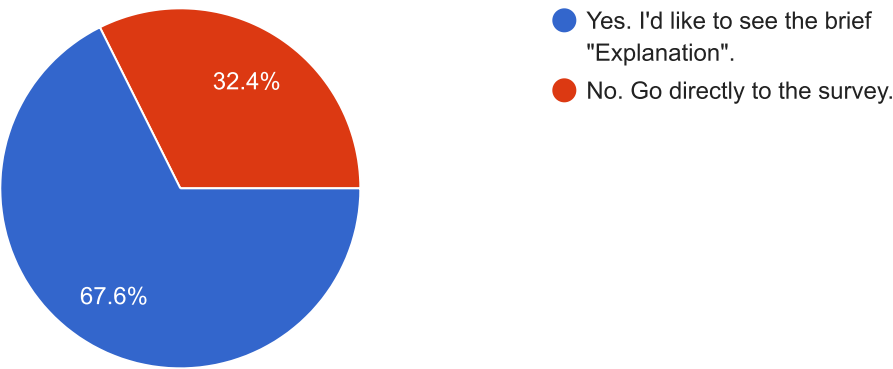

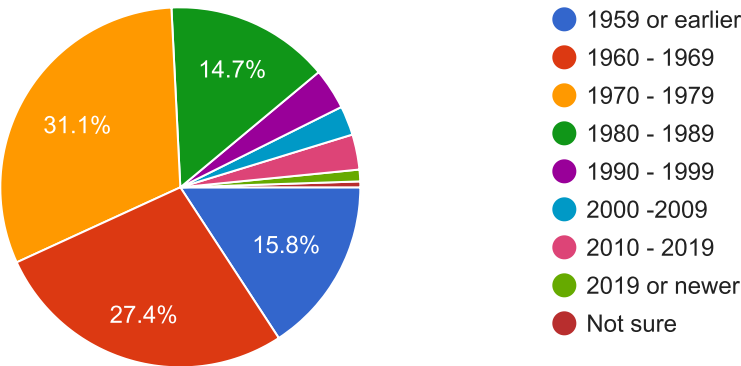

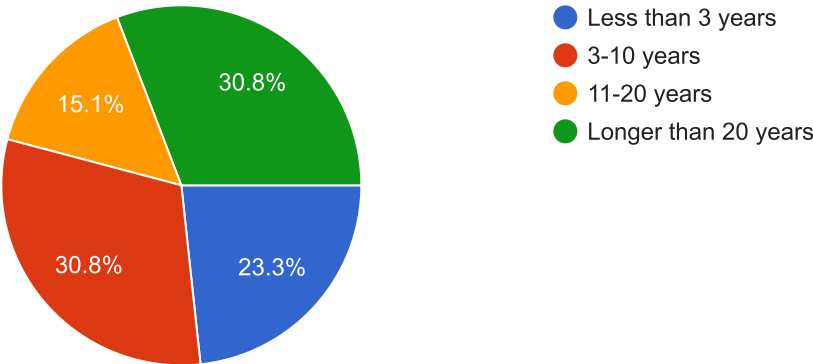

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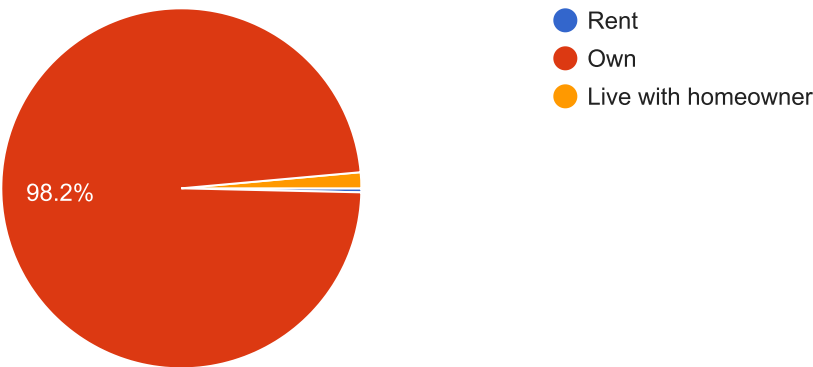

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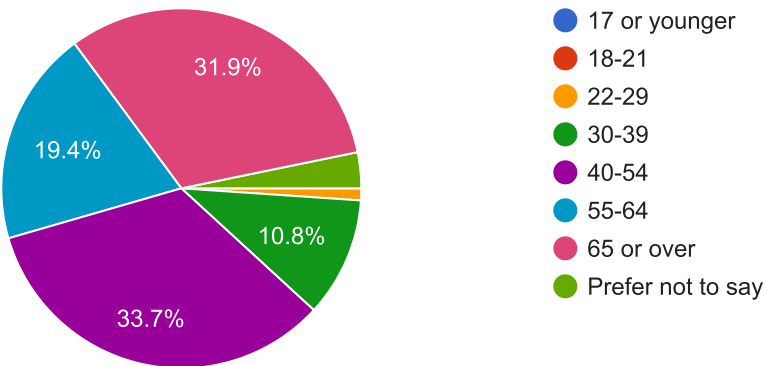

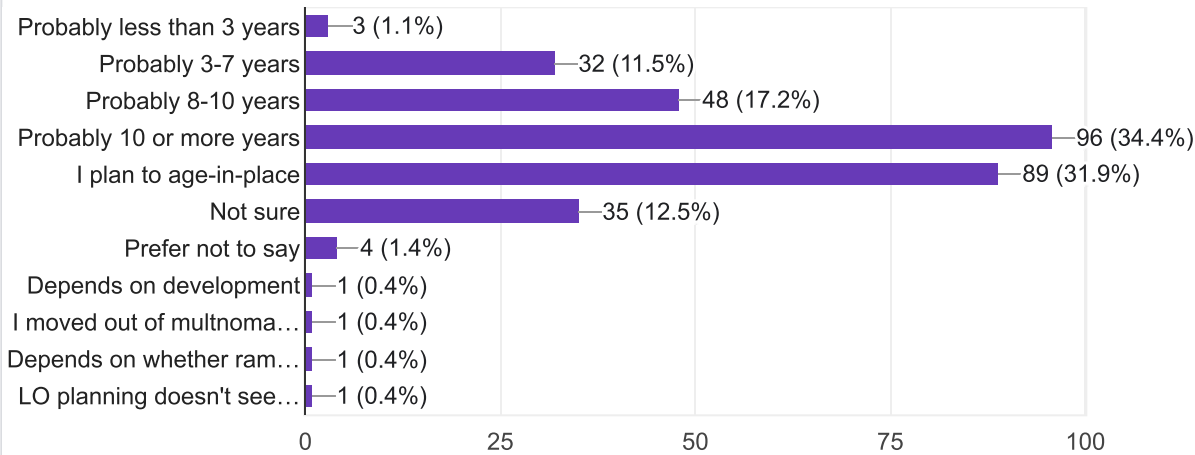

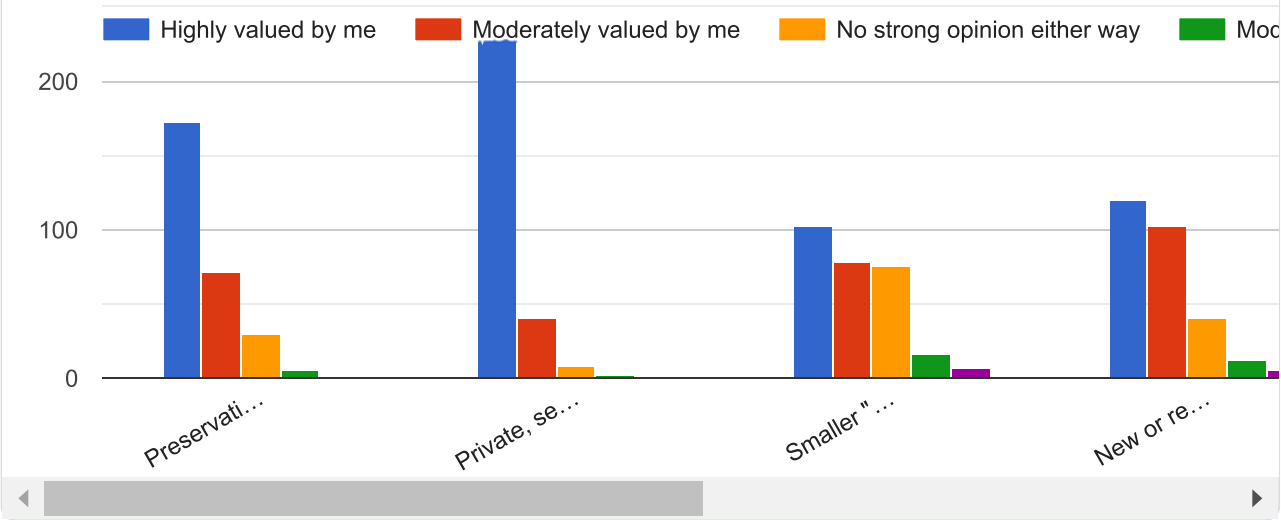

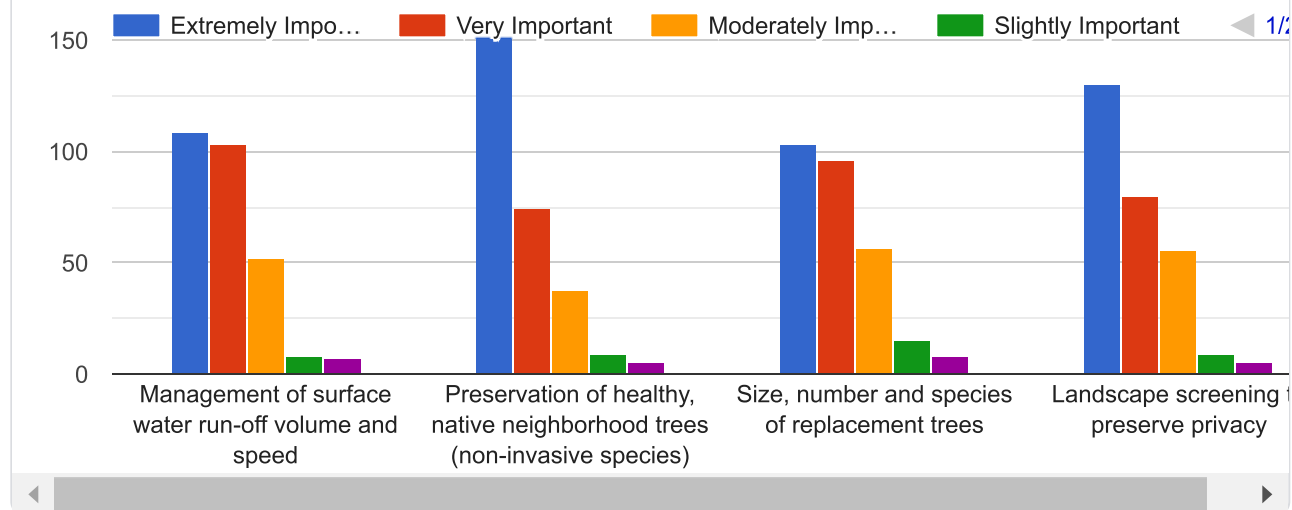

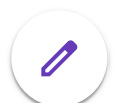
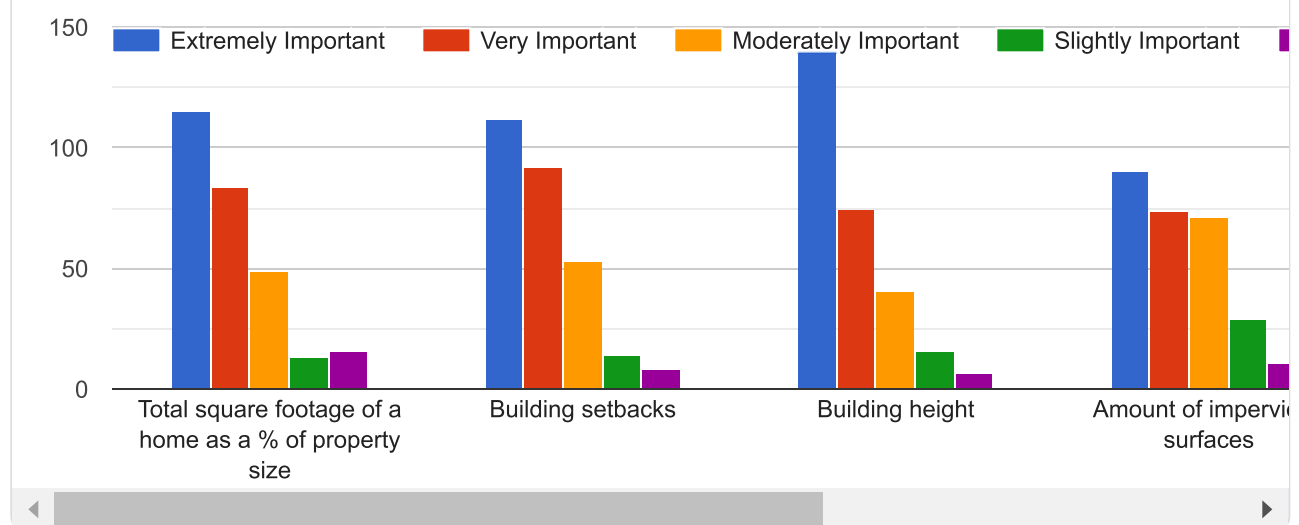
1 of 7: How important are the following Neighborhood Characteristics to you?




3 of 7: How important are the following Natural Systems/Landscaping and buffering elements to you?

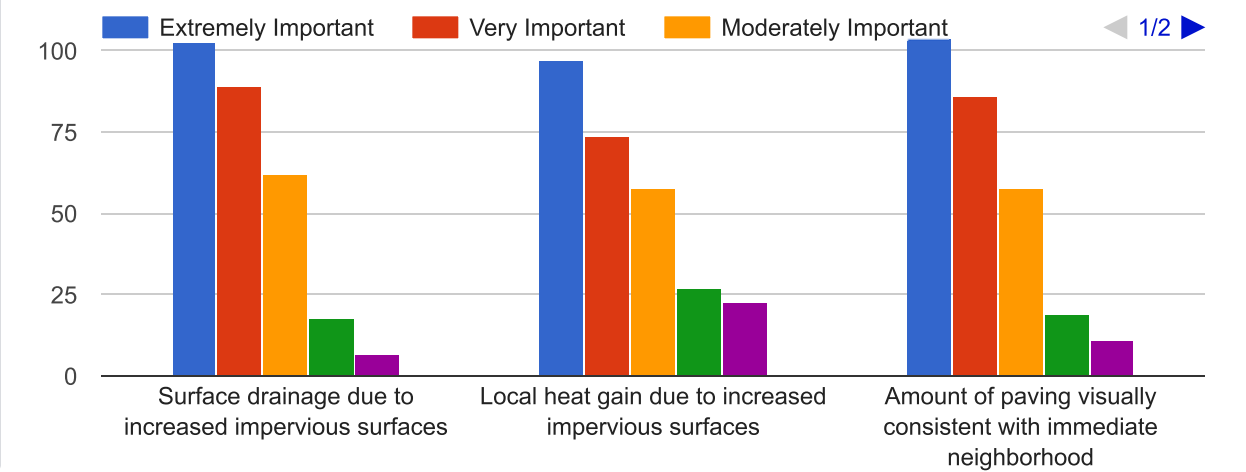


4 of 7: How important are the following elements of Newly-Developed Homes and the Major Remodeling of Structures to you?




5 of 7: How important are the following concerns related to impermeable surfaces to you (i.e. driveways and yard paving)?

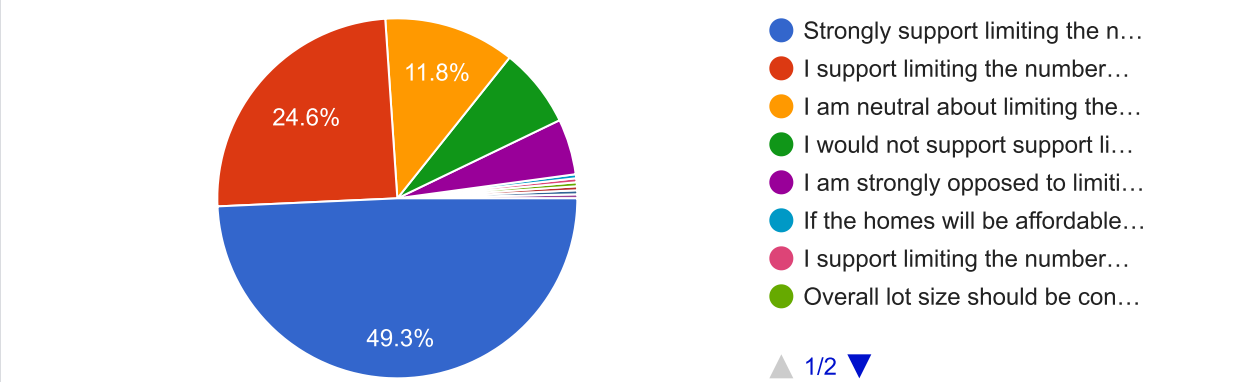
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6 of 7: Some lots in Palisades are large enough to be divided into two or more lots. Most lots are not wide enough to be split down the middle and must be split front to back. This results in “flag lots” (pictured below) where homes are located behind another house on the “flag” portion of the lot, and accessed by a private access lane on the “pole” portion of the lot. Currently, City code allows up to 3 lots. Would you support a limit of 2 total lots regardless of overall lot size?

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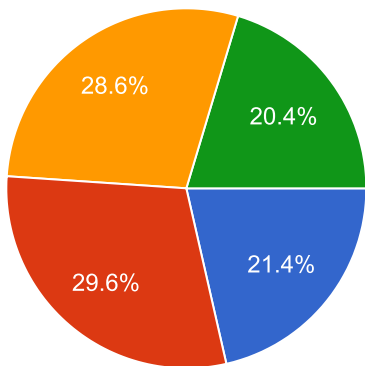
