

Recycling Guide

Recycling question? Wondering what to do with...?

TVs, computers, laptops, printers, monitors, tablets, keyboards, etc.

Electronics like TVs and computers contain hazardous materials and cannot be thrown in the garbage. Safely dispose of these items for free (up to 7 items) by taking them to a participating Oregon E-Cycles location, which includes Goodwill on State Street and on Lower Boones Ferry Road in Lake Oswego.

Styrofoam

Agilyx accepts #6 plastics (which includes Styrofoam) 24 hours a day at their Tigard location, 13240 SW Wall Street. For more information, please visit www.agilyx.com/tigard/drop-off or call 503-217-3160.

Paint

You can drop off up to 5 gallons at a time free of charge at Sherwin Williams (15659 Boones Ferry Road) and Miller Paint (544 N. State St.) stores in Lake Oswego, where it will be recycled through the PaintCare recycling program. You can recycle up to 35 gallons of paint for free at the Metro South (2001 Washington St, Oregon City) and Metro Central (6161 NW 61st Ave, Portland) household hazardous waste facilities. You can also purchase recycled paint from Metro's MetroPaint program at \$18/gallon.



Hazardous Household Waste

Common hazardous waste products include:

- Aerosol spray products
- Art and hobby chemicals
- Batteries
- Fire extinguishers
- Household cleaners and disinfectants
- Mercury-container products (fluorescent light bulbs and tubes, thermometers, thermostats)
- Paints, stains, solvents and thinners
- Automotive fluids
- Pesticides and poisons
- Pool and spa chemicals
- Propane tanks
- Sharps (medical syringes, lancets, etc.)
- Unwanted or expired medicines and drugs

These materials should never be discarded in the trash or poured down the sink or into a street drain.

Dispose of unwanted hazardous household waste at one of Metro's household hazardous waste facilities at Metro South or Metro Central. More information at www.oregonmetro.gov/tools-living/healthy-home/common-hazardous-products.

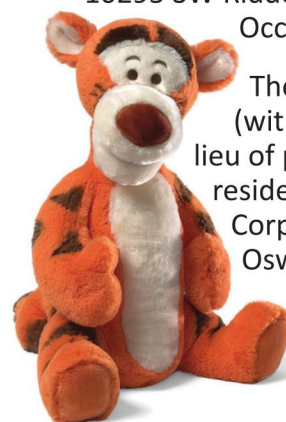

Toys for Tots & Bulky Waste Collection Event

Saturday, October 21, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

At this event, bulky waste (including items such as dishwashers, televisions, refrigerators, computers, dryers, water heaters, couches, mattresses, tables, and clean untreated wood) can be dropped off at the Republic Services / WRI Transfer Station, 10295 SW Ridder Rd., Wilsonville. Proof of residence is required. Occupants must unload all bulky waste as instructed.



There is no charge to dispose of bulky waste items (with the exception of items containing freon). In lieu of payment, organizers request that participating residents donate new, unwrapped toys for the Marine Corps' Toys for Tots Program serving children in Lake Oswego, Tualatin, and Wilsonville.

Recycling

Glass

In separate glass bin

Bottles & jars only
empty & dry, no lids

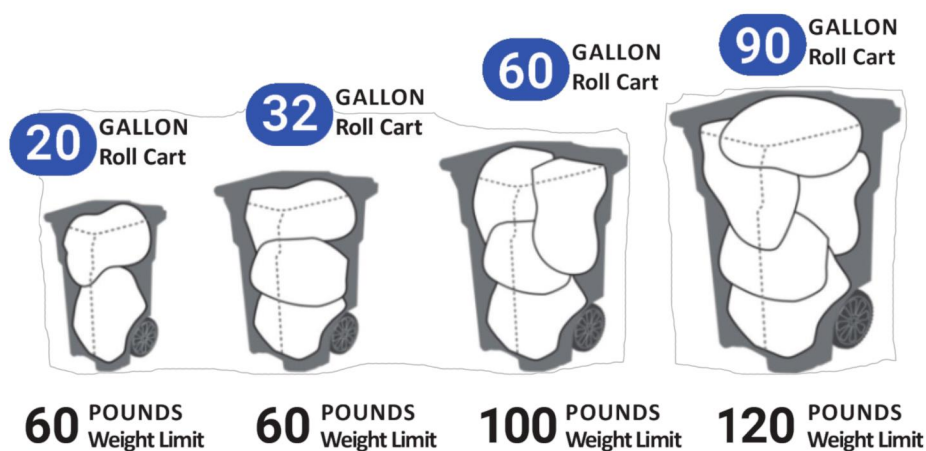
Junk Mail

FOR SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS:

Choose Container Size



Choose Your Service Level

- WEEKLY Pick Up:** One garbage container of any size, plus one additional container each for recycling, glass, and yard waste.
- MONTHLY Pick Up:** One, 32 gallon garbage container, plus one additional container each for recycling and glass. Garbage pick up is monthly; other collections are weekly.
- ON-CALL Pick Up:** One, 32 gallon garbage container. Call for pick up.

Large Items (appliances, furniture, etc.)

Call Republic Services at 503-636-3011 for special pick-up and pricing.

Motor Oil

Put in a labeled, 2 gallon or less, screw-top container (e.g. milk jug) and set next to glass bin. Residential customers only.

Yard Waste

Leaves, grass, small branches, plants & trimmings. Plus, in Lake Oswego, food scraps!

Batteries

Pilas батарейки Bin 电池

1. Prepare



Tape

- Button cells
- Rechargeable
- Lithium/lithium-ion
- Battery packs (laptop/cell phone)



Do NOT Tape

- Alkaline (AAA to D)
- Carbon Zinc
- 6- & 9-volt

2. Bag all batteries



1qt zip-seal bag

3. Set on top of glass
