

2024 Palisades Neighborhood Association Community Survey Results

Do you know our board meetings are all open to the public?





- One other suggestion (from Robert's Rules of Order) is the apply unanimous or general consent for votes that don't really require formal voting. The chairperson can gauge the temperature of the room and decide to move to approve barring any objections. It isn't like we do a lot of voting but it can provide a sense of efficiency during the meeting.
- Have 2 microphones and two members holding them. Explain zoom need so members understand they must always use mic Try to keep meetings shorter so members don't leave. Maybe no intermission.
